UCSD IBD City-Wide Conference



The IBD City Wide event held on Monday, December 1st marked the first in-person conference since COVID, making it an especially energizing and long-awaited gathering for the community. Hosted by **Dr. Brigid Boland**, Director of the IBD Center, the evening brought experts and attendees together for thoughtful discussion and collaboration. **Angelina Collins** presented on the medical management of perianal disease in IBD, offering key clinical insights. **Dr. Samuel Eisenstein, MD** followed with an engaging talk on the surgical management of perianal disease in IBD, rounding out a well-balanced program. It was also a wonderful opportunity for colleagues across the city to reconnect and network face-to-face.

2025 UCSD Senate Distinguished Research Award

Established in the 1983-84, the Distinguished Research Award is one of the UC San Diego Academic Senate's highest honors, recognize faculty whose scholarly contributions have made a lasting impact within their field and advances the university's research mission.

We are proud to share that Dr. Rohit Loomba has been selected as this year's recipient, honoring his work that has transformed the understanding and management of liver diseases. Through his groundbreaking collaborations at UCSD and globally, Dr. Loomba has led major advances in non-invasive assessment of liver fat and fibrosis, laying scientific foundation for today's therapeutics like Resmetirom, a thyroid Beta receptor agonists and FGF-21 analogues.

During his lecture, Dr. Loomba reflected on how far field has come ""When I was in medical school, cirrhosis was considered an irreversible condition, but now it's no; longer irreversible. In some patients we are able to reverse it. Our studies have shown that individuals with family history of MASH cirrhosis have up to 15% higher risk of developing the disease. These findings helped to inform changes in clinical practice, prompting physicians to begin screening patients with a family history of cirrhosis, an important step towards earlier diagnosis and treatment".

Dr. Loomba's work continues to shape the future of MASLD/MASH care and strengthen UC San Diego's leadership in hepatology research.

NEW RESEARCH FACULTY **LUIS ANTONIO DÍAZ PIGA, MD**

Dr. Díaz is a specialist in Gastroenterology and Internal Medicine who trained at the Pontificia Universidad Católica de Chile. As a clinical researcher, he focuses on translational and clinical studies in steatotic liver disease. He has authored more than 160 peer-reviewed publications on gastrointestinal and liver diseases in high-impact journals and co-authored 11 book chapters. He co-leads multinational studies on alcohol-associated liver disease (ALD) and metabolic dysfunction-associated steatotic liver disease (MASLD), including the Global AlcHep Network and STELLA. He serves on the Steering Committee of the ALD Special Interest Group (SIG) of the American Association for the Study of Liver Diseases (AASLD) and chairs the ALD and Public Health SIGs of the Latin American Association for the Study of the Liver (ALEH).

Outside of work, Dr. Diaz is committed to reducing health disparities and has worked closely with the World Health Organization and ministries of health across Latin America to establish and implement public-health initiatives addressing alcohol use and steatotic liver disease. In his free time, he is an enthusiastic astrophotographer.

Dr. Low has earned a distinguished place among UC San Diego Health's highest-rated physicians, standing out as one of just nine doctors to receive a perfect 5-star rating from patients, in a rolling 12 month period. Farewell to Dr. Mary Lee Krinsky

After more than 26 years of dedicated service at UC San Diego, Dr. Mary Lee Krinsky will retire in February 2026.

Mary Lee's journey began as an undergraduate at UC San Diego, followed by medical school at Western University of Health Sciences. After completing her GI fellowship at Yale and advanced EUS training with Dr. Charlie Lightdale at Columbia, she joined the West Roxbury VA as Director of Endoscopy and served on the faculty at Brigham and Women's Hospital. In 1999, she returned home to San Diego to establish the first interventional endoscopy and EUS program at the VA, where she served as Director of Endoscopy until 2022.

As a member of UCSD's advanced endoscopy group, Mary Lee was an early adopter of transluminal EUS-guided interventions and was the first to perform EUS-guided biliary drainage and EUS-directed transgastric ERCP at both the VA and UCSD. She holds two provisional patents—including an ergonomic gripper developed in collaboration with UCSD Engineering and Surgery—and her prospective research and commentary on diminutive polypectomy helped shape modern thinking on polypectomy quality.

A champion of mentorship and inclusion, she co-founded the Association of Women Endoscopists (AWE) in 2017, fostering a growing pipeline for women in interventional GI. In 2023, AWE hosted the first all-women faculty interventional course at UCSD. Internationally, she led AWE's first medical outreach trip to Vietnam and performed the country's first AXIOS stent placement.

Locally, she served as President of the San Diego GI Society in 2005 and brought joy and mentorship to our fellows through GI Jeopardy and her introduction of pickleball to the division.

We are deeply grateful for the innovation, mentorship, and heart Mary Lee has brought to our division.

Please join me in celebrating her extraordinary legacy and wishing her well as she explores new opportunities to advance patient care, and as she joins Nate and their son Zach in supporting their daughter Kate's Paralympic journey in 2026. We look forward to welcoming her back in new and meaningful ways.



Updates from the San Diego Digestive Diseases Research Center (SDDRC)

The overall mission of the SDDRC is to support basic, translational, and clinical research aimed at improving the treatment and prevention of major inflammatory diseases of the gastrointestinal tract and liver. The Center continues to thrive in its seventh year of operation. Drs. Schnabl and Eckmann have led the Center since its establishment in 2019. The SDDRC currently provides the following services:

Core Services and Updates

Human Translational Core provides:

- Access to well-characterized human biospecimens for patients with Metabolic dysfunction-associated steatotic liver disease (MASLD) and Inflammatory Bowel Disease (IBD).
- Access to archival clinical (GI/liver) tissue samples (stained or unstained slides) from the Pathology Department.
- Consultation in pathology, biostatistics, and protocol design.
- Weekly virtual office hour for biostatistics consultation with Xinlian Zhang, PhD, via Zoom, every Monday from 09:00 am - 10:00 am.

Preclinical Models Core provides:

- Services in histology and microscopy including tissue preparation, help in establishing proper fixation, routine and specialized staining, slide scanning, multiplex immunofluorescence, state-of-the-art microscopy, second harmonic generation collagen imaging, intravital imaging, and image analysis.
- Access to germ-free and gnotobiotic mice, and murine models of liver and gastrointestinal disease.
- Access to Human Liver Resource services, which include primary liver cells and liver tissue.
- Monthly virtual histopathology office hours with Kenneth Kim, DACVP, 3rd Thursday of the month from 12:00-1:00 pm.
- Monthly virtual histology office hours with Zbigniew Mikulski, PhD, 2nd Tuesday of the month from 1:00-2:00 pm.
- **New service:** Proteomics services through the Collaborative Center for Proteomics led by Dr. David Gonzalez.

Microbiomics & Functional Genomics Core provides:

- Sample processing for microbiomics studies.
- Sequencing-based assays: Microbiome sequencing, RNA-seq, Single-cell sequencing (RNA, ATAC, Multiome), other sequencing-based assays (e.g. miRNA-Seq, ChIP-Seq).
- Spatial transcriptomics.
- Bioinformatics support:
 - ▶ Microbiomics (e.g. OTU, α/β diversity, shotgun metagenomics, archiving)
 - ▶ Functional genomics (e.g. transcript quantitation, systems biology interpretation)
 - ▶ Consultation and training in specific experimental and analytical techniques related to microbiomics and functional genomics.


